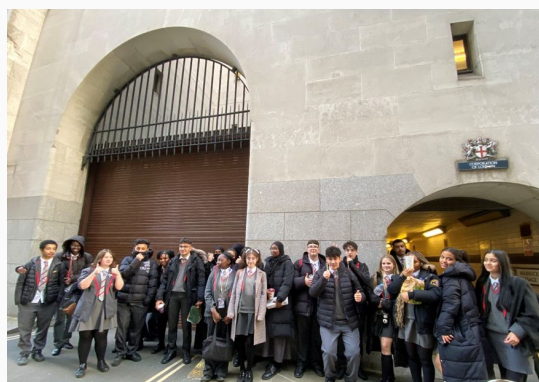


HERON HALL ACADEMY
