
Strength to strength

Reading at home – please help us

Every study and research survey shows that children who read regularly outside of the classroom will do better in all their subjects, including maths. We are very proud of having a dedicated library and library team at the school. Reading is at the heart of what we do as a school.

We ask all our parents to encourage their children to read for 30 minutes each day. Reading around 30 minutes a day allows children's vocabulary to grow and expand, exposing them to as many as 2 million vocabulary words a year.

School meal debts

We are aware that this is a challenging time for many of our families but the amount of money owed to the school is now very significant. This is all money we need for teaching and learning. Can you please clear any debts as soon as possible and make sure your child's account is kept topped up. Unfortunately, we will not be able to provide a hot meal in future if your child's account is in debit.
