## Year 7 Catch Up Grant – allocated £35,456\*

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2). This is then used to provide additional support to help students catch up and make accelerated progress in Year 7. Heron Hall Academy will receive £35,456 for the 2018/19 academic year. This is being used to fund extra support sessions for students in addition to the taught curriculum.

Proposed Impact of Catch-Up Grant for 2018/19: 100% of the students to have made accelerated progress in English with at least 75% of the students to have made accelerated progress in Maths.
