Making a real difference

Heron Hall is an inspiring school where students are encouraged to aim high and shape their futures. It is a place where young people can grow, achieve and succeed. With a proud tradition of academic ambition and diversity, we are committed to empowering every student.

Our mission is to provide a nurturing environment that helps students develop the skills they need and make a positive contribution to society. We invite you to be part of our supportive community and to begin an exciting educational journey with us at Heron Hall Academy.

Keeping students safe

The safety and wellbeing of our students is our highest priority. We want every parent to feel confident that their child is cared for and protected throughout the school day.

Our teachers are on duty in high-visibility jackets every morning and afternoon, greeting students in large numbers to make sure they arrive and leave safely. Senior leaders also take an active role, walking the surrounding streets at the beginning and end of the day, so that children are seen safely on their way home.

Inside the school, we work hard to create a calm and secure environment where students can focus on their learning without distraction. Clear routines, visible staff presence and our strong pastoral system all help to make Heron Hall a safe and supportive place to be. Many parents have told us how much they value this, noticing the calm atmosphere and the reassurance it gives their children.

A school for all

Heron Hall has always placed equality and diversity at the heart of its work. From the outset we have worked with our local community to develop a curriculum that reflects the richness of our students' backgrounds and experiences. In English, for example, students study literature from a wide range of authors, including many from Black, Asian and minority ethnic backgrounds. In History, students explore units that highlight under-represented stories, including African history, alongside opportunities to reflect the heritage of our large Turkish community. Our aim is that all young people can see their own identities and histories reflected in what they learn.

A promise of respect

Every student at Heron signs a diversity pledge, committing to ensure that everyone - regardless of background, race, ethnicity, gender or sexual orientation - is respected and treated equally.

Raising aspirations and career opportunities

Many of our students join us without a clear sense of the opportunities open to them. Some may feel that competitive universities or careers are out of reach. Our careers programme is designed to challenge those perceptions and raise aspirations.

Students take part in workshops, receive guidance from external careers advisers, and are supported with Sixth Form and university applications. They also benefit from meeting top employers and industry professionals who share their experiences.

The sky's the limit

At Heron Hall we celebrate the rich diversity of our community. With large Turkish, Afro-Caribbean and many other communities represented in our school, we make sure our students meet role models who reflect both their own backgrounds and the wider world they are growing into.

Through our partnerships with community organisations, including the Enfield Caribbean Association, our students take part in annual careers fairs and workshops that open their eyes to the opportunities ahead. They see how people like them have gone on to become pilots in the Royal Air Force, neurosurgeons, veterinarians, entrepreneurs, jewellery designers, and creative artists. These encounters show our students that with hard work and belief in themselves, they too can follow a path into these professions.

We also bring inspirational visitors into school - from High Court judges and leading speechwriters to digital creators and local business owners - so that every child can see that ambition can take many forms, and that with determination, every pathway is open to them.



Making a difference beyond the classroom

At Heron Hall we believe education is about more than just exam results. We want our students to grow into responsible, considerate young people who contribute positively to the community around them.

Our ECO Committee leads regular projects such as litter-picking in the local area. These activities not only help improve the environment but also teach our students the importance of respect, teamwork and pride in where they live.

In recognition of this work, Heron Hall has been officially accredited as an Eco-School. This award celebrates the efforts of our students and staff to make sustainability part of everyday life, and it gives our young people the confidence that their actions can have a real impact.

We also work closely with local businesses, who regularly comment on the maturity and responsibility

shown by our students. These partnerships help us to strengthen community ties and give our young people a real sense of belonging.

Our commitment to the environment goes further. Last year the school secured funding to landscape our grounds, with new trees, shrubs and green spaces designed to create a welcoming setting for students and families. The judging panel praised the way our students had been involved in shaping the project and the pride they took in their school.

Heron Hall also has one of the largest solar-panelled roofs in the borough. Students actively monitor the energy being produced and learn how renewable energy supports a more sustainable future. This hands-on involvement helps them understand how their choices can make a difference, both locally and globally.

Beyond environmental projects, our students also take part in:

Charity fundraising - from food bank collections to non-uniform days supporting local causes.

Student leadership roles - such as prefects and peer mentors, helping younger pupils feel supported and safe.

Community volunteering - including helping at local events and visiting care homes to spend time with older residents.

All of these opportunities help our students grow into confident young citizens who understand that responsibility, respect and care for others are at the heart of a successful community.

6 steps for a smooth and confident transition

Our Year 7 'Head Start' programme gives every child an early advantage, helping them adapt quickly, make friends and feel ready for learning at Heron Hall.

- **1. Free Summer School -** A week of subjects and activities to build confidence before September, plus a transition evening for families.
- **2. Free Breakfast Club** All Year 7s receive a free breakfast every day until they graduate.
- **3. Tailored support** Pastoral care and a special transition group, including SEND support, to help students settle in.
- **4. Literacy & numeracy catch-up -** Extra support in the autumn term to close gaps in reading, writing and maths.
- **5. 1-to-1 mentoring -** Selected students paired with trained mentors for guidance and confidence-building.
- **6. Visionaries & Scholars Programme -** Extra challenges such as debating, workshops, trips and masterclasses.

By the time they leave, Heron Hall Sixth Formers are equipped with the knowledge, qualifications and resilience they need to succeed in whichever path they choose.



Quick Fruit & Yoghurt Parfait


Serves 2 / 5 mins

Curriculum

The world is changing fast. While literacy and numeracy remain the essential foundations of every child's education, they are only the beginning.

At Heron Hall, we prepare students not just to succeed in exams, but to thrive in a future where creativity, innovation and STEM subjects - science, technology, engineering and mathematics - will be more important than ever. We also place art and design at the centre of this vision, recognising that creativity is key to innovation. This is the principle behind STEAM: Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics.

Our curriculum combines strong academic standards with opportunities to develop confidence, curiosity and new skills - equipping students for the world they will step into.

KEY STAGE 4 (YEARS 10 & 11)

Students undertake studies to prepare them for their GCSEs. We also prepare students for alternative accreditation. Whatever their path our students follow a core curriculum including:

Mathematics

Science (Triple or Combined)

Physical Education

Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education

Religious Education

Students can choose from a range of additional GCSEs and vocational qualifications. Option choices include History, Geography, Spanish, French, Resistant Materials, Food Technology, PE, Music, Art, Drama, Citizenship, Statistics, Further Maths, Business Studies and Sociology. Work experience placements are provided for all students to help prepare them for life after school and to give them an idea of the type of careers and work that they might undertake in the future.

KEY STAGE 5 (YEARS 12 &13)

Following their success in national examinations in Key Stage 4, many of our students decide to join our new Sixth Form to continue their education. Joining Heron Hall Sixth Form is a choice made not only due to the broad academic and vocational courses on offer, but also for the continuing supportive environment our students will enjoy into Year 12 and Year 13. Students in Year 12 and Year 13 benefit from one-to-one careers advice and a Sixth Form Enrichment Programme that aims to support them in making choices about their future. Planned events include university trips, careers fairs as well as workshops delivered by external speakers and providers.

Homework

Homework is an important part of learning at Heron Hall. It:

- Raises attainment by extending study time beyond the classroom
- Encourages independence and good study habits
- Gives students the chance to practise and reinforce key skills
- Helps teachers check understanding and tailor support
- Strengthens home-school links by keeping parents involved in learning

Regular, well-planned homework supports strong progress and helps students develop the discipline needed for future study and employment.

Extra-curricular activities

We offer a wide and diverse range of extra-curricular activities to help students become confident, independent and well-rounded individuals. Opportunities include sport, dance, drama, computing, photography, languages and creative clubs.

Students also benefit from educational visits and trips throughout the year. These have included tours of top universities, the Globe Theatre, West End shows, Geneva and Disneyland Paris.

As part of preparing for the future, students are also offered opportunities for work experience. This gives them valuable insight into the world of work, helping them to build confidence and develop the skills they will need later in life.

A love of literacy

A love of literacy

Literacy is at the heart of Heron Hall. We have fostered a culture of reading that has raised students' progress and, more importantly, nurtured a lifelong love of books.

- In Year 7, the average reading age is 10 years 6 months.
- In Year 8, it rises to 11 years 2 months.
- By Year 9, it is 11 years 9 months.

Targeted interventions accelerate progress for students who need extra support.

We are proud to be one of the few schools with a full-time, dedicated librarian and a library assistant. Together they lead a wide range of literacy initiatives, including:

- Literacy Walls in every classroom
- Word of the Week every Monday
- The Lexia programme for Year 7 and 8 students
- Bespoke interventions when needed

The library

Our bright, spacious library is one of the most popular places in the school. It is a safe, inspiring space that encourages every student to enjoy reading for pleasure while developing literacy and research skills.

The library is staffed all day by our librarian and library assistant, and is open before, during and after school for lessons, independent study and group work. Students also have access to a range of IT resources, including desktops, laptops and Chromebooks.

Our collection reflects the diversity of our community, with books for all abilities, interests and languages. Alongside fiction, we provide non-fiction and revision texts to support all curriculum areas.

Literacy is supported across Years 7 and 8 through dedicated library lessons and the Accelerated Reader programme. Achievements are celebrated with certificates, badges, trips, book awards and assemblies.

The library also houses a growing careers section with prospectuses and resources to help students explore their post-16 options.

We are very proud of our library and the enthusiasm our school community shows towards it.

Community Outreach

Our dedicated Community Outreach team provides invaluable support for families all year round. They work with a range of partners to deliver free workshops and courses tailored to parents' needs. These include support with returning to work, preparing for interviews, and help with parenting teenagers.

Parents can also meet and connect at our friendly Parents Café, based in the school.

Our partnership with Save the Children is nationally recognised as one of the best in the UK. The team also works with organisations such as Tesco, Farmfoods, Greggs, Waitrose and the Felix Project, who kindly provide weekly food bags for families who need a little extra support.

Well-being support

At Heron Hall, we want every child to feel safe, supported and able to flourish. Our teachers and staff are trained to spot signs of worry or anxiety, and we provide direct access to professional counsellors for students who need extra help.

We are proud of our partnership with **Place2Be**, the national charity dedicated to improving children's mental health in schools. Additional support is also provided by Trust staff specialising in health and wellbeing, as well as our Education Welfare Officer, who helps families improve attendance and overcome difficulties with lateness.



Partners with the University of Warwick

We are proud to work in close partnership with the University of Warwick, one of the world's top-ranked universities. Over the past five years, we have run an extensive teacher training programme with them, producing many newly qualified teachers trained by some of the best education professionals in the country. We also benefit from having a senior Professor from Warwick as a Member of our Board of Trustees.
