Re: Measles Cases

I am writing to say thank you to all those who have checked the Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccination status of their children and ensuring, where needed, that they receive the vaccine. We have seen a very positive response in Enfield, with an unprecedented number of people coming forward for vaccination. Not only will they themselves now be protected but they are also helping to protect vulnerable people who are unable to receive the MMR vaccine.


However, although we have seen a reduction in measles cases in the borough, the disease continues to present a risk in London more generally. I would therefore like to take this opportunity to urge all those who have not yet done so to please check whether their children have yet to receive either the first or second of MMR vaccine. It is not too late to get vaccinated and to be protected against the potentially serious complications of measles.
