- where your lessons are
- what equipment you need
- how homework works
- what to do at break and lunch
- who to speak to if you are worried

What happens before September

There will be several opportunities to find out more about Heron Hall Academy and get ready for September.

Parent tip

Put the key dates in your phone calendar now. Please contact the school office if you are unsure about any date or arrangement.

Your first day

Your first day at secondary school is exciting and a big step. You may feel confident, nervous, or a mixture of both. Many students feel this way.

You will not be expected to know everything on your first day. Staff will welcome you, guide you and help you understand what to do.

When you arrive

- staff will show you where to go
- you will meet your form tutor
- you will meet other students in your form group
- you will begin to learn your timetable
- staff will help you find your way around

Your Checklist

Remember

If you are not sure where to go, ask a teacher or another member of staff. It is always okay to ask for help.

The night before

- Pack your school bag
- Check your pencil case
- Get your uniform ready
- Check how you will travel
- Set an alarm
- Try to sleep well





Who will help my child?

EVERY YEAR 7 STUDENT HAS ADULTS WHO WILL HELP THEM SETTLE IN, LEARN WELL AND FEEL SAFE.

Person or team	How they help
Form tutor	Sees your child regularly and is usually the first point of contact for general questions.
Year team	Helps with progress, behaviour, routines, attendance and day-to-day support.
Pastoral Lead	Gives extra support if a student is worried, upset or finding something difficult.
Safeguarding and inclusion teams	Help keep students safe and provide specialist support when needed.
Attendance officer	Works with families to support good attendance and punctuality.
Autumn term	Students are helped to settle in and parents receive updates

Parent message

Your child will not be left to manage alone. If you are worried, please contact the school early so we can help.

Feeling safe and supported

We know that parents and carers want their child to feel safe, settled and ready to learn.

At Heron Hall Academy, staff help Year 7 students understand the routines of the school, know who to speak to and feel part of the school community.

We support students by:

- helping them understand where to go and what to do
- giving them a form tutor who sees them regularly
- making staff visible around the school
- supporting students during break and lunch
- helping students understand school rules and routines
- working with parents and carers when extra support is needed

Tell us early

Small worries are easier to solve when we know about them early.

Students should speak to an adult in school if they feel worried, unsafe or unsure about something. Parents and carers should also contact the school if they have concerns.

The school day

Students should arrive before 8.40am and be ready for form time. School bells ring throughout the day. Students should move calmly and safely between lessons and arrive on time.

What to bring each day

Being prepared helps you make a good start to each lesson.

Your school bag should include:

- books needed for the day
- black or blue pens
- pencil, ruler and rubber
- scientific calculator
- glue stick
- water bottle

Uniform and PE kit

Students are expected to wear the correct school uniform every day. Full details are included in the separate Heron Hall Academy Uniform Guide. Please read the uniform guide carefully before buying uniform or preparing for September.

Clear routines so everyone can learn

Students do best when routines are clear and expectations are consistent. Clear routines help students feel safe, help lessons run smoothly and allow everyone to focus on learning.

We expect students to:

- arrive on time
- be ready to learn
- follow instructions from staff
- treat others with respect
- move around the school calmly and safely
- speak kindly to others
- take pride in their uniform and equipment
- complete homework on time
- make positive choices

Good attendance helps students:

- keep up with learning
- build friendships
- feel part of school life
- develop good habits
- achieve their best

Parents and carers need to know:

- students must attend every day unless there is a valid reason for absence
- students should arrive before 8.40am
- if your child is absent, you must provide a reason by 9.30am each day
- contact the school early if there is a problem with attendance

Why it matters

90% attendance means a student misses around one day of school every two weeks.

Learning, homework and reading

Year 7 is the beginning of secondary learning. Students study a wide range of subjects and begin to build strong foundations for the future.

Homework

Homework helps students practise what they have learned, prepare for future lessons and develop independence.

Students should:

- write down homework carefully
- check when homework is due
- complete homework on time
- ask for help before the deadline if unsure
- take pride in the quality of work

Homework is set on Google Classroom. Form tutors will show students how to log in.



Reading

Reading is important in every subject. It helps students build vocabulary, understand more in lessons, write more clearly and grow in confidence.

Food, lunch and free school meals

Students can have a school meal or bring a packed lunch.

School meals

The school is cashless. Parents and carers use ParentPay to add money to their child's account. Students do not need to bring cash into school.

Packed lunches

Packed lunches should be healthy and suitable for the school day. Energy drinks are not allowed in school.

Free school meals

The rules for free school meals are changing from September 2026. More families receiving Universal Credit may now be eligible.

Please complete the Enfield Free School Meals / Pupil Premium Application Form if your child already receives free school meals, your family receives Universal Credit, your details have changed, or you think your child may now be eligible.

Staying connected

Arbor Parent App

The Arbor Parent App helps parents see important school information, including messages, attendance, reports and upcoming events.

ParentPay

ParentPay is used for school meals, trips, events and other school payments. Activation details will be sent before your child starts school.
